With the **Extended Access Service**, the court can allow designated court personnel **access to non-public data**.

By default, **JUDICIUM** shows the same information to judge or probation officer subscribers that it shows to the public. If the court chooses to participate in the **Extended Access Service**, it can set up distinct "Security Groups" that have the right to see specific data not available to the public, such as juvenile cases and addresses.

Who might use this service?

- ▶ Judges needing data after working hours
- ▶ Probation officers from the court or circuit

How is it done?

After Exhibit D is in place to hide data from the public, another form sets up Extended Access.

Step 2: Data available to Security Group (Y/N)?

① The court identifies the desired Security Groups.

② The court indicates what each Security Group can see, and sends the form to us

③ Our staff set up the Security Groups as per the court's completed form.

④ Using a password-protected web page, designated Court staff add approved user IDs to the appropriate Security Groups.
